

### New Year, New Life

I need to make sure I am putting first things first. Is what I am spending my time, energy, and resources on something that has eternal consequences for me and others or have I convinced myself that where my wheels are spinning is critical to existence?

Keep the light of Christ shining. Merry Christmas to you all!


